Lyle Richard Refshauge (1926-2020)

CEDAR FALLS – Lyle Richard Refshauge, 93, of Cedar Falls died Thursday, January 2, 2020, at the Western Home Communities – Stanard Family Assisted Living.

He was born February 14, 1926 in Cedar Falls, son of Christian Otto and Kate (Eldridge) Refshauge. He married Darlene D. Diestler on February 23, 1947 at First United Methodist Church in Cedar Falls. She preceded him in death on November 1, 2014.

He graduated from Cedar Falls High School in 1943 and served in the U.S. Navy during WWII. He was employed at the Behrens Buick garage in Cedar Falls, becoming parts manager in 1948. He then moved to Cedar Rapids where he was parts manager for the Allen Imports garage for 11 years, then the Strait Imported Parts store. He then became the Auto Parts Management instructor at Hawkeye Institute of Technology in Waterloo, retiring in August 1988. In retirement, he worked part time at Dike Hardware store until it closed.
