Angela "Angi" Webb (1981-2017)

CEDAR FALLS – Angela "Angi" Webb, 35, of Cedar Falls died Sunday, April 16, 2017 at the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics in Iowa City.

She was born June 10, 1981 in Cedar Falls, daughter of Daniel and Susan Webb.

She graduated from Cedar Falls High School in 1999. She earned her BA degree in Elementary Education with a Minor in Mathematics and her Masters in Informational Technology in Education from the University of Northern Iowa. She was a media specialist for the Waterloo School District at Poyner Elementary School. She was a member of Nazareth Lutheran Church in Cedar Falls.
