



## Betty Brimm

October 6, 1920 - April 10, 2010

CEDAR FALLS-Betty Brimm, 89, of Cedar Falls, died Saturday, April 10, 2010 at the Western Home Communities-Martin Center in Cedar Falls.

She was born October 6, 1920 in Vanderbilt, PA, the daughter of Charles Kiefer and Lillian (Means) Shallenberger. She served her country in the United States Navy (WAVE) during World War II. On May 22, 1949, she was united in marriage to R. Paul Brimm in Cedar Falls. He died October 30, 1985. She received her Bachelor of Arts degree from California State Teachers College in California, PA and her Master of Arts degree from the Teachers College at Columbia University, New York, New York.

Survived by one son, Robert (Kris) Brimm of Cedar Falls; two daughters, Ann (Jim) Pfaff of Eldridge, IA and "Shawna" Jean Brimm of Waterloo; and three grandchildren.

Preceded in death by two sisters, Margaret Kauffman and Joanne Miner.
