Bruce Kevin Troupe, 61, of Waterloo, died on Monday, July 17, 2023, at the Cedar Valley Hospice Home.

He was born on May 18, 1962, in Waterloo, the son of Ross and Amy (Hicks) Troupe. He served in the Navy from 1979 to 1983. On November 5, 1998, he was united in marriage to Lori Spidell in Bronson, IA. He owned Telecommunication Tech, installing phone systems for businesses in and around the Cedar Valley for over 20 years. He was a man of the hour for every receptionist he did work for. His customers were more friends than anything.

Bruce wasn't a man of worldly things. Belongings, money, and titles meant nothing to him. He lived for his family, which extended far beyond blood lines. He left an indelible mark on this world and every person he came into contact with and he will be greatly missed.

Quint, both of Waterloo; grandchildren, Syilehst, Chase, Kirayla, Breyanna, Michael, Alayna, Tristen, Cooper, and Andrew; great-grandchildren, Lucas, Izrayya, and Estella.

He was preceded in death by his parents; sister, Kay; brother, George; and stepson, Brian.
