Delyorce Raye Rebouche, 78, of Cedar Falls, Iowa, died on June 6th, 2024, in Iowa City, Iowa following complications arising from a tragic fall and compounded by the discovery of a very advanced and aggressive cancer.

Delyorce was born on September 26, 1945, in Weeksville, North Carolina. She was the third of three children born of Raymond Bacon and Ivy Bacon. She is survived by her brother, Ralph Bacon.

Delyorce was married to Richard A. Rebouche from 1964 to 1988 and is survived by one child from that marriage. Delyorce met Richard at the University of Oklahoma, but job opportunities brought them to Waterloo, Iowa in 1969. The family then moved to Cedar Falls and eventually landed in a quiet home in the countryside where Delyorce spent the last years of her life.

Delyorce graduated from the University of Northern Iowa with a Bachelor's Degree in Chemistry and worked several jobs as a lab technician, instructor at Hawkeye Tech, chemist, and finally signed on at John Deere where she worked as a chemist until her retirement.

Delyorce had many hobbies over the years, but was most invested in reading, cooking, gardening, and her cats.

Survivors include her son, Richard, two grandchildren, Rick and Robert, and

two great-grandchildren, Ricky and Oliver.

Preceding Delyorce in death were her parents and her brother, Charles Bacon.
