Donald L. Davidson (1927-2009)

CEDAR FALLS- Donald L. Davidson, 82 of Cedar Falls died Sunday, November 22, 2009 at the Cedar Valley Hospice Home.

He was born February 23, 1927 in Duncombe, the son of Thomas D. and Lucile E. Briggs Davidson. He married Rowena E. Garrett on September 4, 1950 in Waterloo.

Mr. Davidson graduated from Duncombe High School in 1944, and attended Iowa State Teachers College where he earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in 1950 and Masters in 1952. He taught Business Education in Spirit Lake in 1953, then in Waterloo from 1954 to 1989. He served in the United States Army during WWII and the Korean Conflict.

Survivors include his wife, Rowena; two sons, Thomas (Michele) Davidson of Lino Lakes, MN, and James (Helen) Davidson, of Arden Hills, MN; two daughters, Jeanne (Eben) Kent of Columbus, OH, and Anne (Richard) Halbmaier of Cedar Falls; ten grandchildren; five great-grandchildren; and a sister, Doris (Horace) Adams of Humboldt.
