August 16, 1934 - March 3, 2025

Donald D. Lindaman passed away peacefully March 3rd, 2025, at his home in Gold Canyon, Arizona.

He was born August 16, 1934, in Wellsburg, Iowa, the son of William J. and Cornelia Irene (Engelke) Lindaman. Don served in the United States Army at Fort Bliss in El Paso, TX, where he met the first love of his life Ada Mae Lloyd. They were married on August 4, 1956. She died August 23, 1999, sharing 43 years together. He then met and married the second love his life, Carol, in 2001, sharing 24 years together. Don graduated from The School of Banking at The University of Wisconsin. He served bank president and chairman of the board of Cedar Falls Trust and Savings/Firststar Bank (now US Bank) until his retirement. He served as the City Treasurer of Cedar Falls for 30 years. While in Cedar Falls, he served as an Elder at First Presbyterian Church. Upon moving to Arizona, he and Carol became members of Gold Canyon United Methodist Church where Don served on many committees.

Don had many passions. He had a love for flying and obtained his commercial pilot license. Driving and traveling on trips were his favorite times. He enjoyed hiking, fishing, mountain climbing, a good game of Turkey Toes, as well as playing golf. Don and Carol also enjoyed going on mission trips with their church groups to Mexico and Costa Rica. Don was a Christian man who loved the Lord.
