CEDAR FALLS – Faye Ann Barr, 79, of Cedar Falls, formerly of Cresco, died Thursday, May 28, 2020 at MercyOne Waterloo Medical Center of COVID-19.

She was born March 3, 1941, in North Buena Vista, Iowa, daughter of Norbert William and Loretta Mary (Dean) Boge. She married Rodney J. Barnes in 1959 and they later divorced. She married Dennis Barr in July 1984 in Cresco, Iowa, and he preceded her in death in 2010.
