August 12, 1918 - September 7, 2014

CEDAR FALLS- Frances E. Fink, 96, of Cedar Falls, died Sunday, September 07, 2014 at the Western Home Communities-Windhaven in Cedar Falls.

She was born August 12, 1918, in Seattle, WA, the daughter of Harvey and Florence Vaughn Baird. She married Robert D. Fink February 23, 1946, in Cedar Falls. He died January 14, 2007.

Fran graduated from Cedar Falls High School in 1936, attended Iowa State Teachers College (UNI) and graduated from Monmouth College in 1942 in Monmouth, IL. She worked at IBM from 1942-1946 in Systems Services. Fran was a member of P.E.O. Chapter KL, Tuesday Club, active member of the church where she taught Sunday School and served as a Docent at the Hearst Center for the Arts.

Survived by: two sons, Douglas (Ruthena) of St. Paul, MN and David (Susan) of St. Louis Park, MN; four granddaughters, Angela (Gabriel) Guererro, Amelia Fink, Kaia Fink, and Mara (Garrett) Klein, and great grandson, Gavin Guererro.
