WATERLOO- Freeman W. Moser Jr, 86, of Cedar Falls died Wednesday, February 9, at Western Home Communities Windhaven.

He was born May 3, 1924 in Waterloo, the son of Freeman W. and Velma M. (Hickle) Moser Sr. He married Florence E. Cutshall on June 30, 1951 in Waterloo. She died December 18, 2003.

He graduated from Waterloo West High School and attended the University of Nebraska. He served in the United States Navy during WWII, and owned and operated Freeman's Caf? for forty-five years, retiring in 1987.
