Gene Lehman (1930-2008)

CEDAR FALLS- Gene Lehman, 78, of Cedar Falls, died Friday, November 7, at the Cedar Valley Hospice Home of cancer.

He was born April 30, 1930 in Cedar Falls, the son of Ernest and Katherine Brown Lehman. He married Sue Gerberich on November 17, 1956 in Cedar Falls.

Mr. Lehman was a 1948 graduate of Cedar Falls High School and a member of the National Guard. He was a salesman for Baxter Clothing before purchasing the business and running it as the Stag Shop for over 30 years, retiring in 1990. He served as Vice-President and President of the Cedar Basin Jazz Festival, and was a member of the Saints Dixieland Band, and later the Sugar Daddy's Jazz Band.

Survivors include his wife; three children, John (Kristie), Josh (Jennifer) and Jill Lehman; six grandchildren, all of Cedar Falls; and a sister, Lois Morgensen of Seattle, WA.

Preceded in death by his parents and a brother, Richard Lehman.

Services will be held 10:30 a.m. Wednesday, at Fredsville Lutheran Church, rural Cedar Falls, with burial in Fredsville Lutheran Church Cemetery. Friends may call from 2 to 7 p.m. Tuesday at Richardson Funeral Home, where family will be present from 5 to 7. Visitation also for one hour prior to services Wednesday at the church.
