Harry was born June 2, 1922 in Vernon County, Wisconsin the son of Oscar and Eva (Larson) Baldwin.

Harry served in the U.S. Army Air Corp in the European Theater during WW II as a Navigator-Bombardier on B-25s and had received the Purple Heart and also the Distinguished Flying Cross. Harry had been an extremely active volunteer for the Red Cross. He held the position of Head Usher and was known as "Candy Man" at First Baptist Church in Cedar Falls.
