Professor James Robinson, Ph.D (1944-2016)

CEDAR FALLS- Professor James Robinson, Ph.D, 71, of Cedar Falls, died Tuesday, January 12, 2016, at his home.

He was born September 7, 1944, in Indianapolis, Indiana, son of James Paul and Mary Jane (Groff) Robinson. He married Linda Turner on December 4, 1977 at Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Cedar Falls.

He earned his BA degree in Religion and History from Wabash College and his Ph.D in Religious Studies from the University of Wisconsin, Madison. He was an Associate Professor of Religion at the University of Northern Iowa.

Survived by: his wife, Linda; a son, Darius Robinson of Waverly; a sister, Sally Robinson of Waterloo; two God sons, Nicolas Fettkether and Bodie Turner, both of Dunkerton.

Preceded in death by: his parents; a sister, Sarah Jane Robinson.
