Jere R. Gregory (1952-2017)

Cedar Falls – Jere Ramsdell Gregory, 64, of Cedar Falls died Thursday, January 12, 2017 at his home.

He was born April 4, 1952 in Memphis, Tennessee, son of George and Shirley (Ramsdell) Gregory. As a child he moved to Oelwein where he lived with his grandparents, Bert and Bernice Ramsdell.

He graduated from Oelwein High School in 1970 and earned his B.A. in education and M.S. in audiology from the University of Northern Iowa in 1983. He worked as an audiologist for Black Hawk Hearing Aid Center in Waterloo before moving to Kalispell, Montana where he worked as an anesthesiology assistant for Dr. James Ronald.

An avid golfer, Jere possessed a lifelong passion for playing, teaching, and discussing the game with friends and family.
