Jimmy Bruce “Jim” Williamson (1938-2020)

CLARKSVILLE – Jimmy Bruce “Jim” Williamson, 81, of Clarksville, Iowa died February 6, 2020 at Clarksville Community Nursing Home, following a lengthy illness.

He was born November 20, 1938, in Jackson, Minnesota, son of Howard Leslie and Nellie Leona (Kelly) Williamson. He married Joyce Aschbrenner on July 10, 1958 in Victorville, California.
