Julianne Kuchenreuther (1923-2014)

CEDAR FALLS- Julianne Kuchenreuther, 90, of Cedar Falls died Saturday, September 27, 2014 at the Western Home Communities Stanard Family Assisted Living Center.

She was born October 15, 1923 in Cedar Falls, daughter of John J. and Margaret Carney McCoy. She married Cecil Kuchenreuther on July 8, 1952 at St. Patrick Catholic Church in Cedar Falls. He died in 1998.

She received a BS degree in Home Economics from Iowa State University in 1948 and taught Home Economics in several small northern Iowa school districts before she married. Later in life, she worked for over 20 years as a cashier in the Maucker Union on the University of Northern Iowa campus.

As a wonderful cook and seamstress, Julianne made a warm and loving home for her family. She read widely, enjoying fiction, as well as books about science, history, religion and the arts, and she actively fostered these interests in her children. She also loved music and the theatre, and missed them greatly as her hearing faded.

She is survived by two daughters, Margaret Kuchenreuther of Morris, MN, and

Catherine (Bruce) Wilson of Iowa City, IA; a son, George (Jeanette) Kuchenreuther of Raleigh, NC; four grandchildren: Karen (Peter) Duquette, Amy Kuchenreuther, Adam Kuchenreuther and Colin Wilson; and a great grandson, Jackson Duquette.

She was preceded in death by her brother, John Francis McCoy.
