Kenneth D. Baxter (1937-2010)

CEDAR FALLS- Kenneth Dale Baxter, 73, of Cedar Falls, died of a sudden heart attack Wednesday, December 22, 2010 at Sartori Memorial Hospital Emergency Room.

He was born December 2, 1937 in Ashley, Missouri, the son of Franklin E. and Mary F. Porter Baxter. He married Maelou Kelly on June 12, 1960 in Bowling Green, Missouri.

He graduated from Missouri University of Science and Technology in 1962, with a Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering. He was an Engineer with The Boeing Company in St. Louis, MO from 1962 to 1976; John Deere Product Engineering in Waterloo from 1976 to 2002; and was presently with DISTek Integration, Inc. He was a member of St. Timothys United Methodist Church, Cedar Falls. He had a passion for family, travel and life.
