CEDAR FALLS-Kirk L. Smith, 62, of Cedar Falls died Saturday, January 30, 2010 at Allen Memorial Hospital in Waterloo.

He was born March 30, 1947 in Waterloo, the son of Paul E. and Eva M. (Larson) Smith. He graduated from Cedar Falls High School in 1966. On May 23, 1982, he was united in marriage to Beverly Doehrmann in Williamsburg, IA. He was employed as a professional photographer at McNally's Photography and later self employed professional photographer.

Survived by his wife of Cedar Falls, son, Bailey Smith of Oklahoma (currently in the Arabian Peninsula with the United States Air Force); daughter Trischa R.
