WATERLOO-Leonard L. Buhrow, 92, of Lakeview Landing in Waterloo died Friday, November 26, 2010 at his home.

He was born December 4, 1917, in Frederika, IA the son of Leonard Louis and Mary (Guhlow) Buhrow. He married Ruth E. Sparks April 4, 1942 in Waterloo. She died August 2, 2003. He served his country in the United States Army during World War II, receiving the Bronze Star. He was employed at John Deere following the war, then was in vending machine sales and service with Coca Cola in Waterloo and later Los Angeles, CA, then Vendo in California, Alabama, North Carolina and back to California, and until his retirement in 1986 with Mars Electronics in California.
