She was born April 1, 1948, the daughter of Carol Charles "C.C." and Margie Ellen (Noe) Baker. She worked as a sewing machine operator at Waterloo Tent and Tarp for 30 years, retiring in April of 2011. She was united in marriage to Gregory Lehmkuhl in 1969 and later divorced. She then married Rollie Oltrogge on September 5, 1993, in Morrison, IA. He died April 21, 2010. She was active working on genealogy since 1993 for the surnames Baker, Noe, Schulz, Oltrogge, and Dammon, was an avid Dean Koontz and Stephen King reader and hand-stitched numerous counted cross stitch projects winning numerous awards at the Iowa State Fair and Cattle Congress.

She is preceded in death by both of her parents and two of her brothers as well as her husband Rollie.

She is survived by her only child Dawn Lehmkuhl Shipp, her sister Debbie Wymore, two brothers Kenny and Larry, one grandson Cody Kohls, and her three great grandchildren Kash, Elon, and Ethan.
