Louis L. "Tud" Eastman (1920-2011)

CEDAR FALLS- Louis L. "Tud" Eastman, 90, of Cedar Falls, died Sunday, May 15, 2011 at the Cedar Valley Hospice Home, Waterloo.

He was born July 17, 1920 in Waterloo, Iowa, the son of Frank and Agnes (Morgan) Eastman. He married Mercina L. Grieger on June 12, 1940 in Waterloo. She preceded him in death on October 4, 2002.

Mr. Eastman served in the US Coast Guard during WWII. He was General Manager of the Viking Pump Iron Foundry, and was later employed as a Supervisor with John Deere, retiring July 31, 1985. He was a member of Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church in Waterloo.

Survived by: three daughters, Bonnie (Bob) Glaser and Jeanne (Ace) Rogers, both of Cedar Falls and Jackie (Bob) Reisinger of Waterloo; a son, Tom (Carol) Eastman of Cedar Falls; twelve grandchildren; fifteen great-grandchildren; and a sister, Molly Plaehn of Waterloo.

Preceded in death by: two brothers, Bob and Bunny Eastman; a sister, Helen Pfiffner; and a great-grandson.

Mass of Christian Burial will be held 11 a.m. Thursday at Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church, Waterloo. Military Honors will be conducted by the Cedar Falls AMVETS Post 49. Public visitation will be from 4 to 7 p.m. Wednesday at the Richardson Funeral Service, Cedar Falls, where there will be a 7 p.m. Vigil Service.
