CEDAR FALLS – Lucy Irene (Sherbon) Boyce, 92, formerly of Seattle, WA, died Sunday, May 17, at Cedar Valley Hospice Home in Waterloo.

She was born January 24, 1923, the daughter of John and Hazel (Price) Sherbon. She graduated from Cedar Falls High School in 1940. She married William Brandhorst on August 1, 1942 in Cedar Falls, they later divorced. On October 14, 1949, she married Gilbert Boyce in Centralia, WA. He died February, 26, 1984.
