Marvin V. Messerschmidt (1931-2014)

CEDAR FALLS- Marvin V. Messerschmidt, 82, of Marion formerly of Cedar Falls, died Wednesday, March 5, 2014, at UnityPoint Health-St. Luke's Hospital in Cedar Rapids.

He was born April 29, 1931, in Shelby County, son of Walter F. and Mabel A. Krohn Messerschmidt. He married Dixie R. Moore on July 23, 1952 in Shelby.

He graduated from Shelby High School in 1950 and was a State Trooper for the Iowa State Patrol for 30 years, retiring in December 1986.
