



## Mary Beckman

September 4, 1923 - December 27, 2010

Mary Green Beckman, born in Rome, Italy, on September 4, 1923, died on December 27, 2010, in Cedar Falls, Iowa.

Mary moved with her family to Laramie, Wyoming in 1924, and then to Detroit, Michigan in 1928. She earned her B.M. degree at Oberlin Conservatory of Music and her M.M. from the Cleveland Institute of Music. For many years she was a renowned professor of harp and music at the University of Northern Iowa.

Mary married Malcolm Beckman, owner of The Hub, a popular Cedar Falls ice cream parlor and restaurant, in 1952. She was extremely active in her church and in community affairs, working as a hospice volunteer and teaching adult literacy, among other things. She received several awards from the governor of Iowa for her contributions to society. She is survived by seven nieces and nephews and six great-nieces and great-nephews.

A memorial service will be held at St. Luke's Episcopal Church on Friday, June 10, 2011 at 10:30 a.m.
