September 22, 1919 - June 27, 2011

CEDAR FALLS-McKinley W. "Mac" King, 91, of Cedar Falls, died Monday, June 27, 2011 at Sartori Memorial Hospital in Cedar Falls.

He was born September 22, 1919, in Kamrar, Iowa, the son of Moroni and Mable (Norcross) King. He married Margaret Brandenburg September 23, 1944 in Harvey, Illinois.

Mr. King served in the United States Navy during World War II. He drove trucks for Benton's Concrete in Cedar Falls and Jensen Transportation in Independence, retiring in 1985.
