CEDAR FALLS - Peggy Jean Wilson, 84, of Cedar Falls died Monday, May 22, 2017 at Satori Memorial Hospital in Cedar Falls.

She was born September 25, 1932, in Tripoli, Iowa, daughter of Mandel and Isabelle (Panzer) Kramer. She married Ray Wilson in Waverly, Iowa in November of 1981. He preceded her in death.

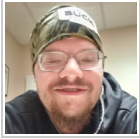

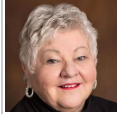
