CEDAR FALLS- Peter J. "Pete" Evers, 81 of Cedar Falls, died Monday, April 26, 2010, in Oklahoma City, OK with his family around him.

He was born June 18, 1928 in Butler County, the son of John and Grace Hemmen Evers. He married Thelma Rewerts on March 12, 1952 at The Little Brown Church in Nashua.

He served in the Navy during the Korean War. He was employed with Viking Pump Co., as a welder for thirty-four years. While working at Viking Pump he also ran Pete's Lawn Mower Shop. When he retired from Viking Pump in 1990 he continued with Pete's Lawn Mower until he retired at age 80.

Survivors include his wife, Thelma of Cedar Falls; son, Dale (Debbie) of Edmond, OK; one grandson, Derek of Nashville, TN; and a sister, Mary (John) Hippen, of Aplington.
