Philip Paul Hufferd (1936-2015)

CEDAR FALLS- Philip Paul Hufferd, 79, of Cedar Falls, died January 4, 2016, at Sartori Memorial Hospital in Cedar Falls.

He was born Dec. 29, 1936 in Ames, Iowa, son of Paul and Mildred Hufferd. He married Joyce Klass on August 23, 1959 in Glidden, Iowa.

He graduated from high school in Coon Rapids, Iowa, received a BA degree in Agronomy/Ag Business in 1959 from ISU and a MA degree in Business from UNI in 1969. He worked for the ISU Extension Service in 1963 in Grundy County and joined the Waterloo Area Extension service in 1969 as an Economics Farm Management Specialist. During Phil's 22 foreign trips he worked with agriculture organizations, local businesses and farmers, providing needs assessment, problem-solving, and sustainable developmental assistance in Russia, Muldova, Ukraine, Ghana, Nicaragua and China.
