CEDAR FALLS- Robert Eller, 90, of Cedar Falls died Saturday, February 20, 2016, at Western Home Communities – South Cottage.

He was born February 14, 1926, in Janesville, Wisconsin, son of Benjamin and Winifred (MacMillan) Eller.

He served in the US Navy during World War II. He earned his B.S. degree from the University of Iowa in 1950 and was employed as an audio/visual instructor with the University of Northern Iowa, retiring in June 1991.

Survived by: a brother, Bruce (Linda) Eller of Raymond, CO.
