Robert D. Fink, 87, of Cedar Falls, died Sunday, January 14, 2007 at Sartori Memorial Hospital.

He was born August 10, 1919, in Monmouth, Illinois, the son of Arthur and Grace (Keener) Fink. He married Frances E. Baird on February 23, 1946 in Cedar Falls.

He served in the United States Army during WWII.

He was a realtor with Baird & Fink Reality and Appraisal for over 58 years, and was Past President of Cedar Falls and Waterloo board of Realtors. He was named Realtor of the Year in 1991. He was Past Commander of Cedar Falls AMVETS Post #49, Past President of the Hawkeye Chapter of the American Red Cross board of directors, and Past President of Cedar Falls Lions Club.
