July 30, 1919 - July 9, 2011

CEDAR FALLS-Robert B. Meyer, 91, of Cedar Falls, died Saturday, July 9, 2011 at the Western Home Communities-Martin Cedar Falls.

He was born July 30, 1919 in Cedar Falls, Iowa, the son of Louis W. and Adelaide (Chmel) Meyer. He married Beverly J. Fisher July 8, 1945, in Cedar Falls, Iowa. She died May 13, 2011.
