Dr. Robert "Bob" Schneider (1948-2011)

CEDAR FALLS- Dr. Robert "Bob" Schneider, 62, of Cedar Falls died Sunday, February 13, at Sartori Memorial Hospital of natural causes.

He was born August 4, 1948 in Baltimore, Maryland, the son of Andrew G. and Mary C. (Cullen) Schneider Jr.

He trained in the USMC, but was never activated. He received his B.A., MSW, and Ph.D. from the University of Maryland, and was employed as an Associate Professor with the Department of Social Work at the University of Northern Iowa.

Survivors include: a sister, Terry MacFarland of New Jersey; a brother, Thomas Schneider of Baltimore; two nephews, Andrew and Daniel Schneider of Baltimore; a niece, Angie Schneider Johnson; and friend, James McCullagh of Cedar Falls.

Preceded in death by his parents.

Private memorial services will be held at a later date in Baltimore, Maryland. Richardson Funeral Home is assisting the family.
