Roselyn T. Ryan (1921-2011)

CEDAR FALLS- Roselyn T. Ryan, 90, of Cedar Falls, died Friday, December 23, 2011 at Allen Memorial Hospital, Waterloo.

She was born December 6, 1921, in Plymouth Rock, Iowa, daughter of Albert and Della (Scheidemantel) Hauber. She married Layle A. Ryan on October 1, 1941 in Cresco, Iowa. He died January 14, 1998.

She retired in 1987 from the University of Northern Iowa where she had been employed for 20 years as a custodian in the student union. She was a member of St. Patrick Catholic Church in Cedar Falls.
