Thomas C. "Cobe" Strack (1919-2014)

CEDAR FALLS- Thomas C. "Cobe" Strack, 95, of Cedar Falls, died Wednesday, May 28, 2014, at the Western Home Communities Elizabeth E. Martin Health Center.

He was born April 6, 1919, in Grundy Center, son of William and Grace Miller Strack. He married Lorraine A. Sulzinger on April 28, 1943, in Boca Raton, Florida.

He graduated from Grundy Center High School in 1937, and served in the U.S. Army Air Corps during WWII. He earned a BA degree from the University of Iowa in 1947, and JD degree from the University of Iowa College of Law in 1949. He served as Grundy County Attorney, was a partner with Willoughby, Strack and Sieverding – Attorneys at Law, and retired from Black Hawk County Abstract Company. He was a member of First Presbyterian Church.

Survived by: his wife, Lorraine; a daughter, Mary (David) Kabel of Cedar Falls; two sons, David Strack of Waterloo and Charles Strack of Logan, UT; and three grandsons: David C., William and Paul Kabel.

Preceded in death by: a brother, Charles Miller Strack; a sister, Nancy Clark;

and daughter-in-law, Dana Strack.
